

PRINCIPAL'S LEGAL HANDBOOK: A REFERENCE MANUAL FOR THOSE INVOLVED IN EDUCATION - NOW RELEASED BY THE EDUCATION LAW ASSOCIATION

Dayton, OH – August 20, 2008 - *The Principal's Legal Handbook* is an authoritative account of current legal issues affecting schools and those involved in both public and private educational institutions. The chapters outline recommendations for practice, summaries and case law.

Published every 4 years by the Education Law Association, this fourth edition is one of the most comprehensive reference publications for educational and legal scholars to date, written by more than 50 experts in the field of education law from across the country. The book was edited by a five-member team of educational law professors lead by Dr. Kenneth E. Lane at Southeastern Louisiana University.

The Principal's Legal Handbook is designed to provide knowledgeable legal insight for school administrators, school boards, principals, faculty, attorneys, students, and parents. This publication is a well-organized assessment of current educational legal issues broken down into 4 sections which include: *Students and the Law, Special Education and the Law, Teachers and the Law, and Schools and the Law.*

With a wide array of topics covered, this is a manual that benefits anyone involved in education. Some of the chapters include: Student Discipline Law, Freedom of Expression, Searches in Public Schools, Child Abuse, Homeschooling and the Law, Civil Liberties in Cyberspace, Student-to-Student Sexual Harassment, Disciplining Students with Disabilities, Barrier-Free Facilities, Academic Freedom and Censorship, Educational Curriculum, Teacher Dismissal, Teacher Certification, Affirmative Action, Charter Schools, School Funding Litigation, The No Child Left Behind Act, School Desegregation during an Era of Judicial Disengagement, Collective Bargaining, and many more.
