ELA Poster Session



The 2010 Annual Conference of the Education Law Association will be held November 10-13 at the beautiful Fairmont Hotel in downtown Vancouver, British Columbia.

The deadline for regular proposal submissions for the concurrent presentations has passed, but faculty and their graduate-level students are invited to submit a proposal for a special poster session, which will be held on Thursday, November 11, 2010, from 5:00-6:30 P.M., concurrent with a reception and immediately prior to our first general session speaker.

Call for Poster Session Proposals

This is the first year that the Education Law Association will hold a poster session. A poster session provides an alternative presentation mechanism that facilitates more one-on-one communication between the presenter and his or her current and future colleagues, and it also allows for a greater participation for all attendees.

Anyone planning on registering for and attending the conference is invited to submit a proposal to participate in the poster session. Poster proposals will be reviewed, and those accepted will be invited to display their posters. Conference attendees who wish to participate in the poster session need to submit a poster proposal for review.

Poster sessions are not for product advertisements, vendor displays, etc.

The Education Law Association is now seeking proposals for poster presentations and virtual poster presentations. Proposals for posters will be accepted May 1 through July 15, 2010, and those accepted will be notified by August 31, 2010.

What is a Poster? What about an Electronic Poster?

A poster is an illustrated summary of the key points about your project. It forms the starting point for a brief and interactive presentation to interested attendees.

Due to the distance of travel, as well as potential difficulties with international shipping or customs, participants will have two alternatives to the traditional presentation at the poster session: 1. Bring the pieces of the poster and assemble it on site, using boards provided by ELA (36" x 48" tri-fold display board); or 2. Create an electronic version of the poster using PowerPoint and display the research on a laptop computer, but please note that Internet service will not be provided.

Proposal Submission Procedure

Starting May 1, 2010, use the online form at www.educationlaw.org/conferences.php to submit your proposal. The primary author should submit the poster, but any additional authors can be noted in the poster description. The poster proposal must include the following:

- Poster title
- Summary (max. 100 words): for the website
- Description:
 - ♦ Detailed description for the poster selection committee
 - ♦ Any notes for the poster selection committee

Deadline for Poster Proposals

In order to plan for the space needed, we ask that poster proposals be submitted by **July 15, 2010**. After that date, poster proposals may still be submitted, but they will be accepted only if space is available.

Thank you, and we look forward to seeing you in Vancouver, British Columbia! Please remember that you **WILL** need a passport to attend, and those who present for the poster session are required to register and pay for the conference.
