**Law and policy in this area are increasingly messy. The past several years have seen a resurgence of research, and courts are being asked to adjudicate many disputes.**

We invite scholars who are active and interested in inclusive campus environments with robust free speech, as well as lawyers and campus leaders, to engage in generative conversations that will inform and help to move forward research in this area. The convening will include discussion of issues relevant to students (i.e. bias response teams), faculty (academic freedom), and the university (both as a site of expression and a speaker).

We plan to provide an overview of data sources for research in this area. We will then seek, together, to identify research questions, briefly assess the extent to which existing research answers those questions, whether empirical or theoretical, and to make connections among researchers with similar interests. The convening will not be anchored by long, formal presentations, but rather will be primarily a facilitated discussion.
